12th January 2025 is the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, when Jesus was baptised in the River Jordan by John the Baptist. We are told, in the Gospel of Luke, that "the heavens were opened, and the Holy Spirit descended on him in bodily form, like a dove; and a voice came from heaven, 'You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased." Just as last Sunday's feast was an epiphany, a showing forth of the glory of God, so too this Sunday we have another epiphany. Jesus, the Messiah, the Anointed one, is anointed by the Holy Spirit and sent to do the Father's will. His baptism by John marks the beginning of His public ministry and the end of His hidden life. We are told elsewhere that Jesus was at this time about thirty years old, and that His public ministry lasted for three years. This Sunday marks the end of the Christmas season, and the beginning of Ordinary Time. This Sunday there will be no sermon: instead we shall be hearing a Pastoral Letter from Bishop Richard.

Liturgical notes

From Monday we are in Ordinary Time and the vestments will be green, the colour symbolic of growth. This will last until Wednesday 5th March, when Lent begins. The month of January is dedicated to the Holy Name of Jesus, which signifies that God saves us. According to St Paul (in Philippians 2:10): "At the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of those that are in heaven, on earth, and under the earth". In Romans 10:13, Paul reiterates the salvific nature of the Holy Name by stating that those who "call on the name of the Lord" will be saved.

Monday is the feast of St Hilary (roughly 310–367), bishop and doctor of the Church. St Hilary was bishop of Poitiers in Gaul, and a stern opponent of the Arian heresy, the mistaken belief that Jesus was a son of God rather than the Son of God, and not of the same substance as the Father. He wrote widely on the subject, refuting the heretics, and spoke truth to power, and was exiled for several years for his steadfast defence of Catholic truth.

Friday is the feast of St Antony, abbot. He was born in Koma in Lower Egypt in 251 to wealthy landowner parents. When he was about 20 years old, his parents died and left him with the care of his unmarried sister. Shortly thereafter, he decided to follow the gospel exhortation in Matthew 19: 21, "If you want to be perfect, go, sell what you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasures in heaven." Anthony gave away some of his family's lands to his neighbours, sold the remaining property, and donated the funds to the poor. He then left to live an ascetic life in the desert, placing his sister with a group of Christian virgins. Many others came to join in his life of prayer and solitude, and for this reason he is considered the father of all monks.

Daily Mass in the week is on Mondays, Wednesday and Fridays at 10am. On Thursday, Mass is at 7pm. On Fridays we shall recite the Rosary after Mass. Confessions are on Saturday morning at 10.30am, until at least 11a,m, with adoration of the Blessed sacrament.

<u>The Holy Year, or Jubilee, has begun, part 2</u>

The Jubilee opened on Christmas Eve, at 7 p.m., with the rite of the opening of the Holy Door at St. Peter's Basilica in the Vatican immediately before Pope Francis celebrated the Christmas Mass. Holy Doors were also opened at Rome's three other major basilicas: St. John Lateran on December 29, St. Mary Major on January 1, and St. Paul's Outside the Walls on January 5. A Holy Door was also opened on December 26 at Rebibbia Prison, which Pope Francis has visited twice before to celebrate Mass and wash inmates' feet on Holy Thursday. The doors represent the passage to salvation Jesus has opened for humanity, the same Jesus who says of Himself 'I am the door' (John 10:9). In 1423, Pope Martin V opened the Holy Door in the Basilica of St. John Lateran - the Diocese of Rome's cathedral - for the first time for a jubilee. For the Holy Year of 1500, Pope Alexander VI opened Holy Doors at Rome's four main basilicas. At the end of a Holy Year, the Holy Doors are formally closed and then bricked up by masons. There are Holy Doors at all English Cathedrals, so one does not have to go to Rome to pass through the Holy Door this year.

On the weekend he is away, the 'other' Fr Graham (Preston) will be celebrating the three Sunday Masses (including the Saturday Vigil Mass.) Many thanks to him for his availability. On Thursdays Fr Simon Hall will come over from Epsom to celebrate the 7pm Mass, and on Wednesdays Fr Anthony Churchill will come from Cobham to celebrate the 10am Mass. Many thanks to them as well. The other Masses, on Mondays and Fridays, will be cancelled. Pauline Groves will supervise the opening and closing of the Church, which will also be open during the hours the parish Secretary is here. Father Alexander will also be away on Saturday 18th January, thanks to a longstanding invitation to chair a meeting with a well known Catholic public figure in London. On that evening Fr Simon will celebrate the Mass.

Thomas Horgan RIP

His funeral Mass will be here on Monday 3rd February at 1.30pm, to be followed by committal for cremation at the Church door.
