### 29th September 2024 is the Twenty-Sixth Sunday of the Year.

In the first reading, from the Book of Numbers, God sends His spirit down on the seventy elders, who are appointed to help Moses, as well as on two others; Moses, rather than wanting to rebuke the two spirit filled men in the camp, wishes that all God's people were recipients of His spirit and prophets. In the second reading, Saint James rebukes the rich, not just for being rich, but for practicing injustice and persecuting the less fortunate. He points out that earthly riches are of passing, not eternal, value. In the Gospel, from Saint Mark, Jesus says the disciples are not to stop a non-disciple working miracles in Jesus's name, and that 'Anyone who is not against us is for us.' This raises for us today the important question of the relationship between revealed faith, other religions, and people of no faith at all.

This Sunday we shall be hearing a brief appeal at all Masses for Cafod. The Harvest Family Fast Day is this Friday. Please consider fasting on this day and donating the money you save to Cafod for its important work. This is not just a collection, but rather a chance for you to be involved by feeling hunger on behalf of those in Africa, many of whom have no access to the luxury foods we habitually consume, such as alcohol, sweets, meat and so on. Doing a family fast is an effective way of helping the young understand the issues of global poverty and inequality.

### Liturgical notes

We are in the month of September, dedicated to the Seven Sorrows of Our Lady. October, which is soon to begin, is dedicated to the Holy Rosary. It is also the month of prayer for the missions. On days when there is no feast, we shall celebrate either a Votive Mass of the Blessed Virgin or the Mass for the Propagation of the Gospel.

**Monday** is the feast of Saint Jerome (circa 347- 420), priest and doctor of the Church. He was a great scholar and dedicated himself to Biblical studies and translated the Bible from Greek and Hebrew into Latin. This version of the Bible is known as the Vulgate. He also wrote many letters to various correspondents in many parts of the Roman Empire, dispensing religious advice, which are an important source of historical insight to the Church of his day.

Tuesday is the feast of Saint Therese of Lisieux (1873 – 1897), doctor of the Church. A nun who died at an early age, Therese is one of the most influential saints of our time. Her writings became famous after her death, and she is an exemplar of how to seek holiness through the challenges of daily life. She is patroness of the missions.

Wednesday is the feast of the Holy Guardian Angels.

**Thursday** is the feast of the Blessed Martyrs of Sussex. They were ten in number and died for the faith in penal times. Their names are: John Rugge, Thomas Percy, Thomas Pylcher, Henry Webley, Edward Shelley, Ralph Crockett, Edward James, George Gervase, Thomas Bullaker, William Howard. The first was a victim of Henry VIII, and the last was a victim of the Popish plot of Titus Oates in the time of Charles II.

Friday is the feast of Saint Francis of Assisi (1181-1226). Francis is among the most revered and loved of Catholic saints.

We have heard the sad news of the death of **Mary Josephine Jones**, which happened on September 5<sup>th</sup> 2024 at Epsom Beaumont Care Home. She was eighty years old. Her Requiem Mass will take place here on Friday 11th October at 1.30pm, to be followed by burial at St Mary the Virgin Church in Ewell. (This will replace the 10am Mass on that day.) Let us continue to pray for the repose of Mary's soul, and the comfort of her family at this difficult and sad time for them. Do please note the date and come of you can to the Mass. Father Alexander recently met up with the **St Anthony's Group**, which is our parish group that looks after the sick and housebound. We are now building up a list of parishioners at home who would like to be visited by a member of the parish. If you think this is something you could do, please get in contact with a member of the group. Ministry to the sick and housebound is very important. If you know of a parishioner who is at home permanently, please mention their name and details to Fr Alexander. At present we do not have that many on our list, so there must be plenty of people we do not know about.

Father Alexander has met up with representatives of the **Guides and the Scouts.** One thing that was discussed was the upkeep of the hall. More important by far, though, was the matter of developing and strengthening the ties between the parish and our uniformed groups. To this end both will be taking part in the 10.30am Mass on Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> November, which is Remembrance Sunday.

**The Core Group**, otherwise the Transition Group, met last week. We considered how the things we wanted to put in place by September have now been put in place: daily Mass (except Tuesdays), the offertory procession, the collection, and Holy Communion under both kinds. We talked about the work to be done on the Hall in half term, namely the refurbishment of the kitchen and the flat roof above the entrance. We also talked about the transition to one parish with the rest of the deanery and how that was going.

The results of the count last week are as follows: 6pm-72; 8.30am-76; 10.30am-143. The total Sunday attendance was 291. Many thanks for allowing yourselves to be counted, and to the clickers for counting you! This will be done again on the next three Sundays.
