Sunday 30th March is the Fourth Sunday of Lent

The readings and prayers can be found in the purple books on page 168. The first reading is from the Book of Joshua, and tells of the Children of Israel entering the Promised Land, eating of its fruits and celebrating the Passover. In St Luke's Gospel, Jesus tells us His in some ways greatest parable, that of the Prodigal Son. Prodigal means extravagant: the younger son has gone abroad, wasted his inheritance on reckless living, and comes back offering to be a servant, but is received as a son. The blameless elder brother feels the injustice of this, but is gently rebuked by the loving father. Are we sons, or are we servants? What is our attitude to the Father? Both sons have the wrong attitude, one wanting to run away, and one thinking he is just an unpaid and unrewarded drudge; we need to realise we are God's children, and loved by Him.

The Fourth Sunday of Advent is known as Laetare Sunday, after the first word of the entrance antiphon; we rejoice because we are halfway through the rigours of Lent.

To mark this the vestments are rose, which is a milder shade of purple.

Liturgical notes. We are in the season of Lent

This **Thursday** A to Z of Catholicism takes place after the 7pm Mass, with 'P is for Purgatory.' Before Mass we have Junior Catechism for all who want it at 6.25pm. Purgatory is a very important Catholic doctrine. What is its Biblical basis? What can we expect to happen to us after we die? Is Purgatory best understood as a place or a state or even a process? How are we to pray for the souls in Purgatory, and what is the role of indulgences? On **Friday** evening, Stations of the Cross are at 7pm, and will last about 25 minutes. This week, the Stations are going to be led by Cafod. Daily Mass in the week is on Monday & Wednesday & Friday at 10am. On Tuesday Mass is at 7am and on Thursday, Mass is at 7pm.

The charity Right to Life UK has a simple online mechanism to allow people to contact their Member of Parliament and it only takes a few moments to submit a message to ask an MP to stop assisted suicide being rushed into law.

We have had a meeting with our new tenants of the Hall. These ladies are going to run a SEN childcare group, which is going to operate on Saturdays in the holidays. The current St Clement's Preschool will continue as normal. This is obviously a very good arrangement as it maximises the use of the Hall. During our meeting it became clear that the Hall and the garden require several remedial interventions, because of the needs of SEN children. The fencing of the garden will be renewed, and we also need to tidy up and repair certain features of the garden. We also need to look at work on the loos. Also with two groups using the Hall, we need more storage space, which means clearing out quite a bit of junk. To this end we are getting a skip. Please watch this space getting a skip, and the very first task will be clearing a lot of stuff from the stage. To this end, look out for two upcoming events. The first will be SKIP DAY, and the second will be GARDEN DAY. We would love to have all hands on deck for both!

Update.

Our skip will be here on Saturday 5th April, and we would love it if a lot of people came to join in this community building exercise. People of all strengths and abilities are welcome. In addition there may be stuff that can go to charity shops or to the recycling centre. If we were to have some drivers with large cars/vans, who could undertake this, that would be simply wonderful. We will start at 2pm, weather permitting.
