**Sunday 1st September, 2024 This Sunday is the Twenty Second Sunday of the Year.**

In the first reading, from the Book of Deuteronomy, Moses tells the people of Israel that the law they have received from God is to be valued and cherished. In the Gospel, from Saint Mark, Jesus makes clear that the law of God, which is moral and directed at the human heart has been obscured by the customs that have grown up around it which deal with purely physical things. He reminds us of the sins which we must most avoid, listing them as follows: 'fornication, theft, murder, adultery, avarice, malice, deceit, indecency, envy, slander, pride, folly.'

**This Sunday, Rod is going to speak at all Masses about the various works in the parish & raising funds for these works.**

**Liturgical notes**

We are in the month of September, dedicated to the **Seven Sorrows of Our Lady**, the feast day of which falls on the 15<sup>th</sup> of this month, which this year is a Sunday. On days when there is no feast, we shall celebrate a Votive Mass of the Blessed Virgin. What are the Seven Sorrows (or Dolours) of Our Lady? They are all found or implied in the Gospels, namely:

The Prophecy of Simeon 'A sword shall pierce your own heart' in Luke 2;

The Flight into Egypt in Matthew 2;

The Loss of the Child Jesus in the Temple of Jerusalem, in Luke 2;

Mary meeting Jesus on the Via Dolorosa, the fourth station of the Cross;

The Crucifixion of Jesus on Mount Calvary in Matthew 27, Mark 15, Luke 23, and John 19;

Jesus's Descent from the Cross in Matthew 27, Mark 15, Luke 23, and John 19;

The Burial of Jesus by Joseph of Arimathea in Matthew 27, Mark 15, Luke 23, and John 19.

**This Sunday, and every Sunday, Holy Communion can be received 'under both kinds'.**

The priest will be at the centre administering the Host: you are asked to approach in two lines. Then, after receiving the Sacred Host in the usual manner, you can receive from the chalice either at the left or the right-hand side of the sanctuary, returning to your place in the usual way. When Holy Communion is over, the ministers should bring the chalices back to the altar for purification.

**Tuesday** is the feast of Saint Gregory the Great (540 – 604), pope and Doctor of the Church, apostle of England.

**Wednesday** is the feast of Saint Cuthbert (634 – 687).

**Thursday** is the feast of Saint Teresa of Calcutta, Mother Teresa.

**Friday** is the first Friday of the month, when it is customary to celebrate a Votive Mass of the Sacred Heart.

Please remember that this week, **Owen Roe RIP** is being buried at Epsom Cemetery at noon on Monday. On the same day, **Dave Campbell RIP's** funeral is at Randall's Park at 2.45pm. On Tuesday at 10.30am, we are celebrating the funeral Mass of **Jean Marshall RIP**. Jean's coffin will be committed for cremation at the Church door. After the Mass there will be tea, coffee and cake in the Hall organised by our social committee.

**Daily Mass in the week is on Mondays, Wednesday and Fridays at 10am. On Thursday, Mass is at 7pm.**  
**This week there is also Mass on Tuesday at 10.30am, it being Jean Marshall's funeral**

**Father Graham's Leaving Presentation**

When a priest leaves a parish, it is usual to make a presentation to him, to mark his years of service and as a sign of gratitude. This is particularly the case when a priest is retiring from active ministry. We will then bank all the donations and round the sum up and present it to Fr Graham.

Confessions are on Saturday mornings at 10.30am, until 11am (at the earliest). During Confessions, the Blessed Sacrament will be exposed for silent Adoration.

### Mary's Meals

Mary's Meals would like to invite you to collect all your foreign currency\* no matter how old or obscure. In two weekend's time there will be envelopes at the back of church for you to take home and put all your foreign coins and notes into. Clear out your drawers and have a look under the sofa. Currently the charity feeds over 2.4 million young children one good meal every day in their place of education – by giving Mary's Meals your foreign coins and notes you can help feed the next hungry child. Mary's Meals feeds children in over 17 countries. Because of our low costs we can do this for as little as £19.15 per child per year! \*We will also take UK coins/notes that aren't legal tender.

A few weeks ago we were outlining the **proposed new Baptism course**, which is over several sessions (mostly on Zoom, for the convenience of parents with small children) and which needs the involvement of a team of parishioners. The second session, via Zoom, is entitled 'What do you ask?' and focusses on two things: what families think baptism means, and what God intends for us through baptism, the sacrament which is the beginning of our transformation in Christ, or becoming our best possible selves. In other words, Baptism is not simply a naming ceremony, but the beginning of a lifelong relationship with God, the Church, and our vocation to be the people He calls us to be.

#### **We are all baptised, but how do we live out the vocation we received at baptism?**

There are numerous ways, but here are three, one more than last week: By welcoming others into the church, by word, action, demeanour. This could mean helping with the Baptism course.

\* By proclaiming the Word out loud, that is, by reading in church. Any more takers?

\* By being conscious that in our baptism we have received a vocation to be our best selves, to be transformed in Christ, and this vocation lasts out entire lifetime.

Our Church is open during the hours of daylight, every day, apart from Tuesday, so people can come in and pray. If the red 'sausage' is in the doorway, this means the door is unlocked.

We have been straightening the benches in Church. This is still a work in progress, and will continue next Wednesday. You may note that some of the 'extra' chairs have been repositioned. Watch this space.

The 'day' will be divided into three parts: spiritual, with a time for prayer; a reflexion on why Holy Communion under both kinds is important, and then a question and answer session. Please take this as your invitation to attend. We will meet in the Church.

### Proclaimers' Day

On Saturday 5<sup>th</sup> October, starting at 10.30am and running until 1pm at the latest, we plan to have a Refresher Day for Proclaimers. The 'day' will be practical and spiritual in nature, looking at how the proclamation of the Scriptures is an integral part of the Liturgy and how proclaiming is part of our baptismal vocation. Would any members of our congregation like to consider this ministry? If so, please get in touch. The only qualification is to be baptised and to have made your First Holy Communion, and to be able to read.
