Sunday 16th February is the Sixth Sunday of the Year

The readings and prayers can be found in the purple books on page 139. The first reading is from the prophet Jeremiah and contrasts two differing ways of life: those who trust in the Lord and those who do not. The person of faith is like a tree which draws its strength from the water of the stream; in the same way, we rely on the grace of God to help us and sustain us. In Saint Luke's Gospel, we hear the Sermon on the Plain, where Jesus salutes as blessed all those who are poor and downtrodden as the true possessors of the Kingdom of God.

Liturgical notes

We are in Ordinary Time and the vestments are green, the colour symbolic of growth. This will last until Wednesday 5th March, when Lent begins. The month of February is dedicated to the Holy Family, and on days when there is no feast, we shall celebrate a Votive Mass of Saint Joseph or a Votive Mass of the Blessed Virgin.

Monday is the feast of the Seven Holy Founders of the Servite Order. They were a group of Catholic merchants in Florence who were devoted to Our Lady, who decided, in the year 1245, to retreat from the city to Monte Senario nearby, in order to devote themselves to God in prayer, eventually forming the Servants of Mary, or Servite Friars. Friday is the feast of Saint Robert Southwell, (c. 1561–1595) priest and martyr. He was an English Catholic priest of the Jesuit Order. He was also a significant poet of the Elizabethan era, and a clandestine missionary in England. After being arrested and imprisoned in 1592, and intermittently tortured and questioned by priest hunter Richard Topcliffe, Southwell was eventually tried and convicted of high treason against Queen Elizabeth I, but in reality for refusing to take the Oath of Supremacy, renounce his belief in the independence of the English Church from control by the State, and similarly repudiate the authority of the Holy See. On 21st February 1595, Southwell was hanged at Tyburn. In 1970, he was canonised by Pope Paul VI as one of the Forty Martyrs of England and Wales.

Because Lent is now not so very far off, we need to start thinking now of what we plan to do. On Tuesdays in Lent we shall celebrate an early morning Mass for workers and others at 7am. On Fridays in Lent, we shall have Stations of the Cross at 7pm. The Stations will last 25 minutes. In addition, we all need to think of two personal things: what we should give up, and what we should take up. The giving up could perhaps be an item of food, drink or tobacco; the taking up should be something spiritual.

Daily Mass in the week is on Monday, Wednesday and Friday at 10am. On Thursday, Mass is at 7pm. Confessions are on Saturday from 10.30am until at least 11am, along with Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.

The next Parish Open Meeting will be on Saturday 18th May after the 10.30am Mass.

Many thanks to those who came to last week's meeting. Next time we will try to streamline procedures to make the meeting swifter and, we hope, deeper.

In addition, Churches together is sponsoring a social project under the aegis of ROC (Redeeming Our Communities) which will lead in due course to a Conversation about what needs to be done in our Borough and how we can all help. The Holy Year, or Jubilee, has begun, part 7

Many famous sites & artworks in Rome & at the Vatican have been cleaned or restored for the jubilee, much to the chagrin of many tourists in 2024, who found major monuments obscured by scaffolding. While many jubilee events will take place in Rome & at the Vatican, it's a celebration for the whole church. On Dec. 29, diocesan bishops opened the Holy Year locally with Masses at their cathedrals. Catholics are encouraged to make pilgrimages to their cathedral during the year, as we shall be doing in May. The Jubilee Year concludes with the closing of the Holy Door at St. Peter's Basilica Jan. 6, 2026, on the feast of the Epiphany. However, the Holy Doors at Rome's other major basilicas will close Dec. 28, 2025, the same day dioceses are to end local celebrations of the Holy Year.
