<u>Christmas Newsletter</u>

Welcome to our End of Advent and Christmas newsletter, which contains our programme of events for the Christmas season. A very happy Christmas celebration to you all, over the Twelve Days of Christmas, and a very Happy Year of Our Lord 2025 when it arrives.



Sunday 22nd December is the Fourth Sunday of Advent

In the first reading the prophet Micah extolls the not very important village of Bethlehem, hailing it as the place where the future ruler of Israel, the Messiah, is to be born. The Gospel, from Saint Luke, focusses on the Blessed Virgin, who is to bear the Saviour of the world, and who has rushed to see her cousin Elizabeth, who is also pregnant with John the Baptist, who, even in the womb, is aware of the Saviour's presence in Mary's womb. Like John and Elizabeth, we too are preparing to welcome our Saviour with joy.

Monday 23rd December is the final Monday of Advent and Mass is at 10am

After Mass Confessions will be heard and the church will be cleaned & tidied. All are welcome to help! <u>Tuesday 24th December is Christmas Eve</u>

Confessions can be heard on application in the Presbytery during the day. The Vigil Mass of Christmas is at 5.30pm; the readings and prayers can be found in the purple books on pages 94-97. We will use the Gospel from Mass during the Night. Mass during the Night is at 10pm, and the texts can be found on pages 97 to 99 of the purple books.

Wednesday 25th December is Christmas Day

The Dawn Mass will be at 8.30am (see the purple books pages 100-102), and the Mass during the Day will be at 10.30am (see the purple books pages 102-104).

At all of the Christmas Masses, in keeping with tradition, the offertory collection is the parish's gift to the priest, for his maintenance throughout the year. This is one of two collections for this purpose, the other one being at Easter.

<u>Thursday 26th December, the second day of Christmas, popularly known as Boxing Day,</u> is the feast of Saint Stephen, the first martyr. Mass will be celebrated at 12 noon, and carols will be sung. Saint Stephen is the patron saint of altar servers.

<u>Friday 27th December, the third Day of Christmas, is the feast of Saint John the Evangelist,</u> the beloved disciple and the author of the Gospel that bears his name. Mass will be at 10am, and carols will be sung. <u>On Saturday 28th December and Sunday 29th December, the fourth and fifth days of Christmas</u>,

we celebrate the feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. The prayers and readings are to be found in the purple books on pages 105 to 108. Mass is at the usual times: 6pm on Saturday, and 8.30 and 10.30am on Sunday morning.

Monday 30th December is the sixth day of Christmas and will be a dies non, that is to say the Church will be closed all day and Mass will not be celebrated.

Tuesday 31st December is the seventh day of Christmas and the feast of Saint Silvester,

pope, who baptised the Emperor Constantine, and was the first pope of a Church that was no longer persecuted. As it is the last day of the year of Our Lord 2024, New Year's Eve, it is customary to give thanks to the Almighty for all the graces and mercies that we have received this year, which means that at Mass we shall have the Te Deum, the traditional hymn of thanks. Mass will be at 10am.

Wednesday 1st January 2025 is the eighth day of Christmas and the feast of Mary, Mother of God

The readings and prayers are in the purple books on pages 109 to 111. On this day, the first of the year, it is customary to sing the Veni Creator, the Come Holy Spirit, to ask Almighty God to sustain all our hopes and projects for the New Year. Mass will be at 10am. Carols will also be sung.

Thursday 2nd January is the ninth day of Christmas,

and the feast of Saints Basil the Great and Saint Gregory Nazianzen. Mass will be at 7pm, after which the parish Core Group will be meeting.

Friday 3rd January, the tenth day of Christmas, is the feast of The Holy Name of Jesus, commemorating the naming of Jesus eight days after his birth. Mass will be at 10am.

On Saturday 4th and Sunday 5th January, the eleventh and twelfth days of Christmas,

we celebrate the Epiphany of the Lord, marking the occasion when Jesus showed Himself to the Wise Men from the East. We shall be singing all the popular carols associated with the feast. Mass is at the usual times of 6pm on Saturday evening, and 8.30am and 10.30am on Sunday morning.

The readings and prayers for the feast are in the purple books on pages 114 to 118.
