Sunday 22nd September, 2024 is the Twenty-Fifth Sunday of the Year.

The readings this week carry on with the theme of the Suffering Christ that we heard last week. In the first reading, from the Book of Wisdom, the godless plot a shameful death for the virtuous man, which we read as a prophecy of the plot against Jesus by the Pharisees and Sadducees. In the Gospel, from Saint Mark, Jesus once more foretells His suffering and death, and how His disciples must take the lowest place rather than aim to exercise power and seek worldly glory. He takes a little child as a practical and living example of Christian humility. He then instructs us how we are to behave: 'Anyone who welcomes one of these little children in my name, welcomes me; and anyone who welcomes me welcomes not me but the one who sent me.' This contrasts with the bad things that have clearly been going on and which are condemned by Saint James in his letter, such as wars, battles, envy and jealousy.

Liturgical notes

We are in the month of September, dedicated to the Seven Sorrows of Our Lady. On days when there is no feast, we shall celebrate a Votive Mass of the Blessed Virgin.

Monday is the feast of St Pius of Pietralcina (1887-1968), better known as Padre Pio, the famous Capuchin, miracle worker and stigmatic of our own time, who has been immensely influential.

Tuesday is the feast of Our Lady of Walsingham.

Thursday is the feast of Saints Cosmas & Damian, martyrs. They were two brothers and doctors, who were martyred in the persecution of Diocletian.

Friday is the feast of St Vincent de Paul (1581-1660), who was known for his charitable work with the poor and destitute. Next Sunday we shall be hearing a brief appeal at all Masses for CAFOD. As mentioned last Sunday, fasting is a good work. You might like to know that children in Africa rarely eat sweets, unlike children and adults here. If we go without sweets (or some unnecessary thing) and send the money we save to people in Africa, we would be doing a good work.

Many thanks to all those who organised, cooked, cleaned up afterwards, prepared for, & supervised the superb leaving party for Father Graham. The food was delicious & we were greatly blessed in the weather, & we gave Father Graham a wonderful send off. Thanks to the generosity of the parishioners during her visit and with a top up from the 8.30 Mass coffee donations, we have send her £500 which equates to R11,330 in South Africa and will go a long way.

Our Facebook group is now over 270 strong, a mere two months after it started. It is a very useful way of communicating, so please encourage other friends to join it. The more the merrier. It is very important for us to increase our Church's name recognition, and social media does help in this. Do share posts, particularly with local groups.

We are outlining the **proposed new Baptism course**, which is over several sessions (mostly on Zoom, for the convenience of parents with small children) and which needs the involvement of a team of parishioners. The fourth session is the Rite of Welcome, and done at Mass. The fifth session is entitled 'God loves you – who is He?' What exactly do we all think God is like? How do we picture Him? How does this fit in with the Christian revelation of God as the Blessed Trinity, Father, Son and Holy Spirit? These are some of the questions that need to be asked so we can come to a real and deeper understanding of God. If God is real (and He is) how do we communicate with Him, and what does it mean to be in a relationship with Him? The session then invites people to mediate on the meaning of Jesus' statements about Himself in the gospel of John: I am the Bread of Life; I am the Light of the World; I am the door/gate; I am the Good Shepherd; I am the Resurrection and the Life; I am the Way, the Truth and the Life; I am the true Vine.
We are all baptised, but how do we live out the vocation we received at baptism? There are numerous ways, but here are nine, one more than last week:
* By welcoming others into the Church, by word, action, demeanour. This could mean helping with the Baptism course.

* By being conscious that in our baptism we have received a vocation to be our best selves, to be transformed in Christ, and this vocation lasts our entire lifetime.

* By being conscious that you are called by name, which you received from your parents and which was mentioned at by our baptism, and that your name is important, being known to God, your Guardian Angel and your patron saint.
* By doing works of charity. * By living the Church's year, and following the Church's calendar.

* By having hope in the future, being one called to glory. * By reading the Bible.

* By having a vivid picture of God in our minds, and by knowing that we are living a life shared with Him.

Come and help us celebrate the 50th Anniversary of the Lourdes Pilgrimage in our Diocese.
