<u>Sunday 2nd February is the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple, or Candlemas</u>

The readings and prayers can be found in the purple books on page 296. All Masses this weekend will start in the Hall with the blessing and lighting of candles; we will then process into the Church with our lighted candles, the short way, if it is raining, the long way if it is fine. As the Gospel relates, forty days after His birth, Mary and Joseph brought Jesus to the Temple to present Him to the Lord in accordance with the Law of Moses. There He was recognised by Simeon and Anna as the Light of the World and the Messiah. Today's feast, among other things, recognises the joyous fact that the days are growing longer, noticeably so, and the darkness of winter is almost over. Candlemas is the feast of the 'quickening of the year.' After the last Mass of Candlemas, the Crib will be dismantled. Next year we shall have new Crib. The old one is going to a new home.

Next Sunday, 9th February, is the Parish Open Meeting

In the Hall after the 10.30am mass, you are all invited to come and discuss matters to do with all aspects of Parish life. The curator of the minutes and the agenda is Fiona Perks. Do speak to her if there is anything you would like to put on the agenda. If you do not know who she is, please ask.

Liturgical notes

We are in Ordinary Time and the vestments are green, the colour symbolic of growth. This will last until Wednesday 5th March, when Lent begins. The month of February is dedicated to the Holy Family, and on days when there is no feast, we shall celebrate a Votive Mass of Saint Joseph or a Votive Mass of the Blessed Virgin.
Monday is the feast of Saint Blaise, bishop and martyr (died 316). The saint, on his way to execution, stopped to cure a child who had a fishbone caught in his throat, at the behest of the child's mother. He is thus invoked as the saint who helps those with throat disease, and on this day it is traditional to bless throats. This is usually done at the end of Mass, but because we have a funeral, this will be transferred to Wednesday.
Wednesday is the feast of Saint Agatha, (roughly 231-251), virgin and martyr. A native of Catania, she was martyred for her stout refusal to abandon her faith in Christ or her dedication to Him in virginity, and was subjected to horrible tortures. She is greatly revered in her native city and many other places besides. The Blessing of Saint Blaise will be after Mass.

Thursday is the feast of Saint Paul Miki and his companions, the martyrs of Japan. Paul Miki was born into a wealthy Japanese family. He was educated by the Jesuits. He joined the Society of Jesus and became a well known and successful preacher – gaining numerous converts to Catholicism. The ruler of Japan, Toyotomi Hideyoshi, began persecuting Catholics for fear of the Jesuits' influence and intentions, and possibly that of European visitors. Miki was arrested and jailed with his fellow Catholics, who were later forced to march 600 miles from Kyoto to Nagasaki, all the while singing the Te Deum. On arriving in Nagasaki – which today has the largest Catholic population in Japan – Miki had his chest pierced with a lance while tied to a cross on 5 February 1597. He preached his last sermon from the cross, forgiving his executioners. Crucified alongside him were Joan Soan (de Gotó) and Santiago Kisai, also of the Society of Jesus, along with twenty-three other clergy and laity, all of whom were canonized by Pope Pius IX in 1862.

Please remember that this week we have two funerals, that of Thomas Horgan at 1.30pm on Monday, which will replace the 10am mass, and that of Sean Carrig on Friday at 10am. You are all invited to both of them, as it is a pious action to be present at funerals. Let us remember the debt we owe Tom and Sean, both of whom were very active in getting this Church built. May they rest in peace and may their good works now be rewarded.

Daily Mass in the week is on Monday, Wednesday and Friday at 10am. On Thursday, Mass is at 7pm. Confessions are on Saturday from 10.30am until at least 11am, along with Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.

<u>The Holy Year, or Jubilee, has begun, part 5</u>

The year calls Christians to action. Pope Francis called for "signs of hope" in the Jubilee Year, including the desire for peace in the world, openness to life and responsible parenthood, and closeness to prisoners, the poor, the sick, the young, the elderly, migrants and people "in difficult situations." Pope Francis has called on affluent counties to forgive the debts of countries that would never be able to repay them, and address "ecological debt," which he described as "connected to commercial imbalances with effects on the environment and the disproportionate use of natural resources by certain countries over long periods of time."
